General Information:

1. The Civics EOC Assessment is a computer based exam.
2. All students enrolled in 7th must take the EOC.
3. Civics is required for promotion to high school.
4. The EOC addresses major topics, trends and analysis of individual rights, responsibilities, and functions of local, state and federal laws.

2. Role, Rights, and Responsibilities of Citizens (25%)
3. Government Policies and Political Processes (25%)
4. Organization and Function of Government (25%)
