

- **What educational platforms will my child be required to use to continue education while school is closed?**  
 K-5: Google Classroom (Accessed through Clever – either with the badge or login)  
 6-8: Canvas (Accessed through Canvas directly)  
 Ms. Nadal will send school wide updates and messages via email and text to all families.
- **How often will my child be required to log on to Canvas 6-8<sup>th</sup> Grade/Google Classroom K-5<sup>th</sup> Grade?**  
 Students will be expected to log on to daily to check for any new work that is available for completion. All work for the week will be due Saturdays at midnight.  
 ✓ Teachers will also have office hours that will include 1-on-1 sessions, questions from parents/students, and/or small group mini lessons. Teachers will be posting their hours within their Google Classroom Page and Canvas.
- **Will I need any materials that my child left at school?** No.
- **Will lessons be posted during Spring Break?** No. This is only if we have to begin virtual classes after March 30.
- **What types of assignments will my child be required to complete during school closure?**  
 For students in grades K-8, students will continue to be required to complete a minimum of 45 minutes in Reading AND Math. Additionally, teachers will be assigning differentiated lessons for students based on their levels. Students will continue to have access to their online textbooks, where applicable; and will therefore be assigned work on an ongoing basis.

Although daily attendance will not be taken, students working within the platforms submitting the required work in a timely manner will be used to monitor the attendance component.

All assignments for the week will be due by Saturday at midnight. 6-8<sup>th</sup> grade tests will be given throughout the week and students will be provided a two day work period for those tests assigned.

- **Which subjects will have pre-recorded lessons so I know my child has watched them all?**  
 Teachers will have to record at least two per week, but there will be an assignment attached so they will know if their child submitted because the grade will be in PowerSchool. K-5 Specials will also create lessons and will require students to complete an activity for a grade.

- **What time can I expect a lesson posted by?** All lessons and assignments for the following week will be posted by **Sunday at 8:00 PM** either on Canvas (6-8) or Google Classroom (K-5).
- **Where will my child submit their work?**  
For students in Grades K-5, they will submit their work through Google Classroom. For students in Grades 6-8, they will submit their work through Canvas. Parents should email teachers with any questions about assignments or grades.
- **Will my child's work be graded?**  
Yes. Assignments submitted through Canvas or Google Classroom will be graded and those grades may be viewed as usual on PowerSchool. You can expect the same turnaround time of 72 hours for graded work.
- **Will my child have an opportunity to communicate with his/her teachers?**  
Yes. Your child's teachers will send communication via Canvas or Google Classroom related to online "office hours". Teachers will be sharing their Zoom code so that students can meet with them digitally. Additionally, teachers will be checking email several times daily and responding to student and parent questions. One on one meetings can also be set up through ZOOM/Google Hangout which is an online meeting space.
- **Will teachers be posting video lessons for students?**  
Yes. Video lessons will be posted to ZOOM/Google Classroom and families will be notified through Canvas or Google Classroom. For this reason, it is imperative that you log on each day to check for updates.
- **Will I be able to contact the school administration while school is closed?**  
Yes. All school administrators will be available by email throughout the day to answer questions and can be available by telephone as well.
- **How will my student receive additional support as ESE/ESOL or student as we move towards virtual learning?**

We recognize that many of our students will need support throughout this process. Since we are posting all items for the week by Monday morning, students have the week or more to complete assignments. Both ESE teachers, will be working to create a schedule in order to meet with students that require a certain amount of support time based on their IEP. ESE teachers will also hold office hours that will shared with all staff and parents in order to support students. They will also be meeting with students on a rotating basis. Please reach out to Ms. Herrera for ESE support and Ms. Gonzalez for ESOL support.

- **What about High School credit courses?**

All high school courses and assignments should continue as usual.
