Your focus is to build authentic units by creating the end first. The idea is to figure out what your scholars will master then work backwards to see how you can help your scholars accomplish this. The MYP unit-planning process is an important expression of the inquiry cycle that frames teaching and learning in IB World Schools. Inquiry, Action, &, Reflection. These cycles should be developed like a road map. Coming and going from one inquiry cycle to the other. Working backwards benefits the true cycle and creates authentic units.

Ambassadors

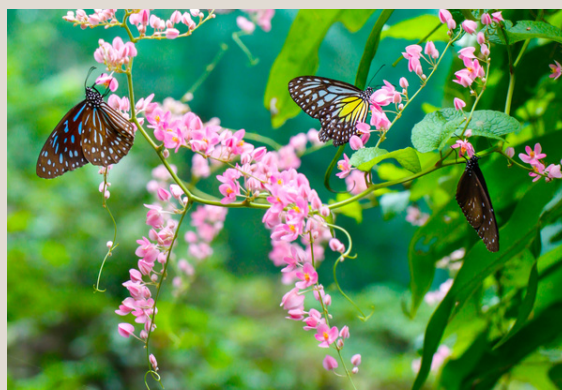
